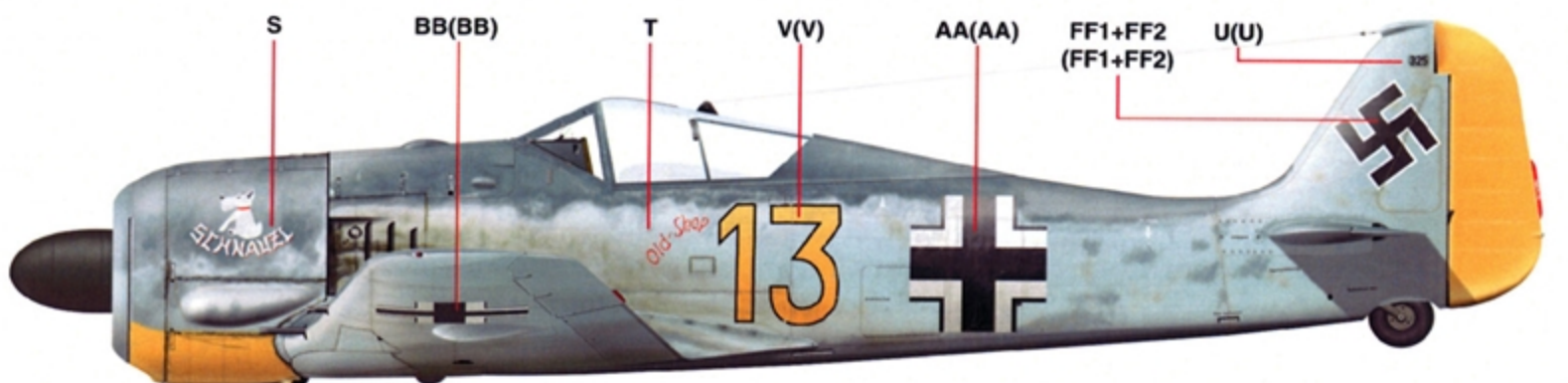
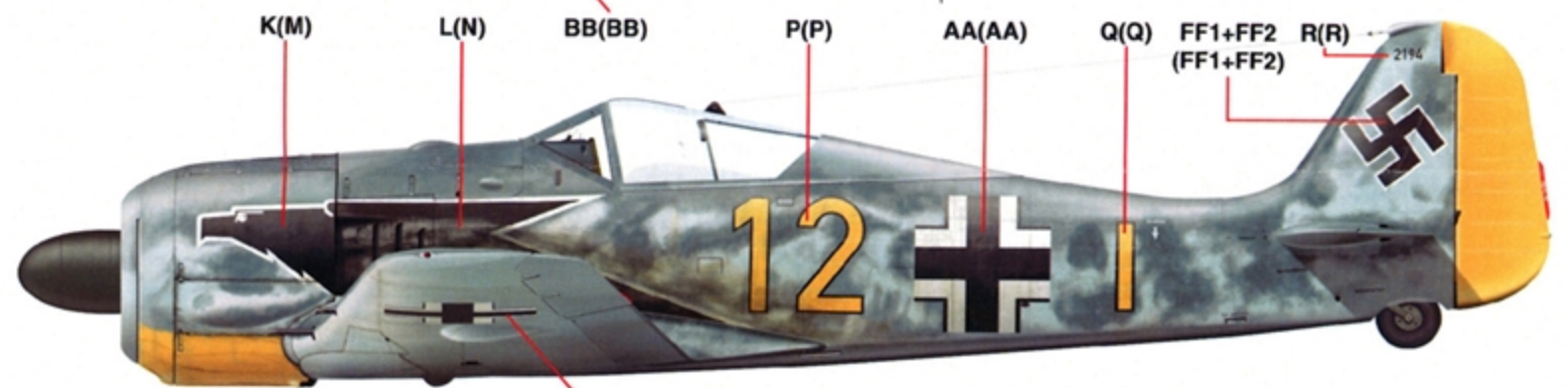

Note size & position of this yellow panel

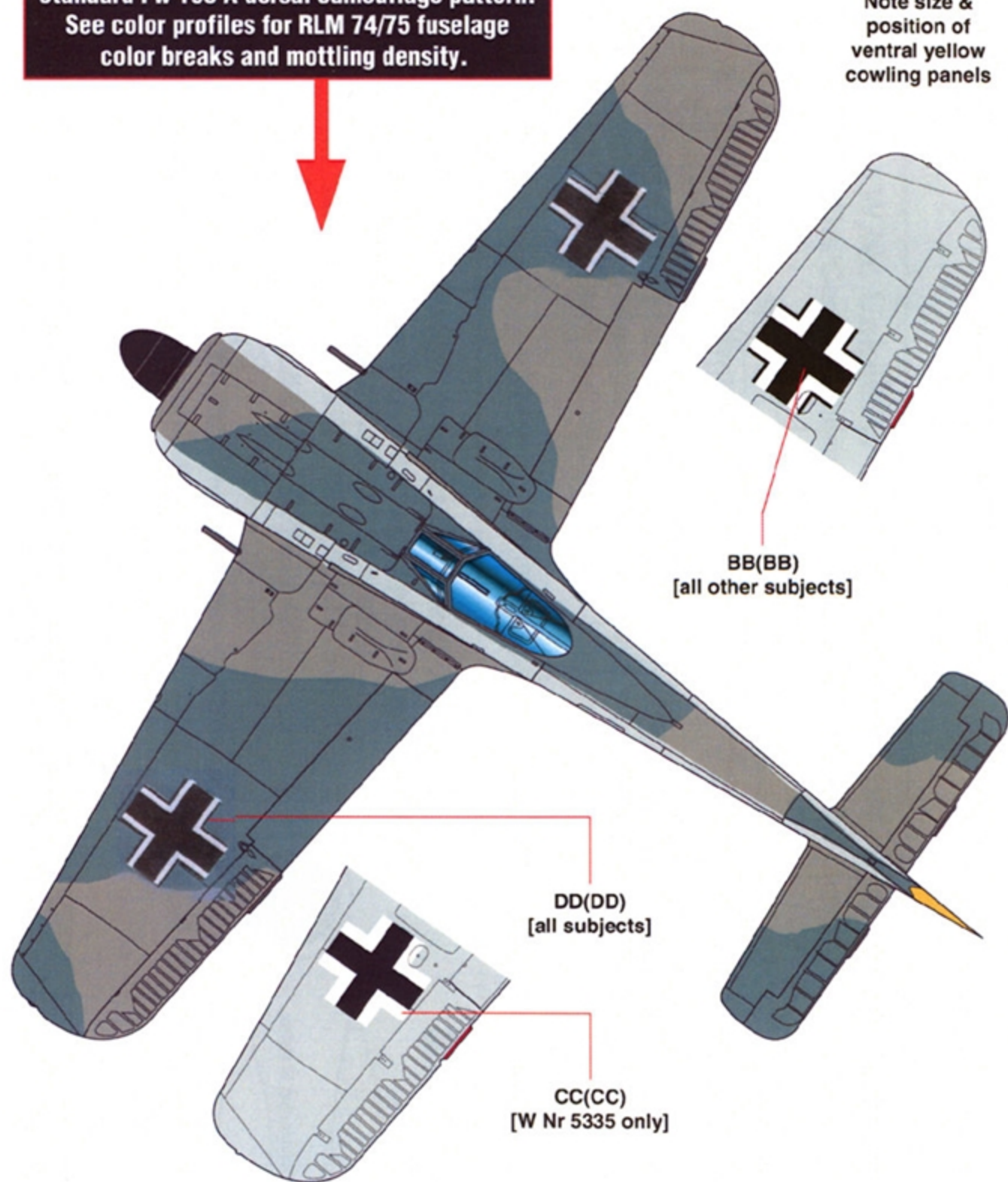

This pristine Fw 190 A-2 or A-3 is believed to be in service with the *Stab* of IV./JG 5. The W.Nr. is unknown; date is believed to be middle of 1942 somewhere in Norway. Noteworthy points are: the early long-necked pilot's armor, with no supporting wires plus no data plate is attached to the fuselage.



"Yellow 12", 9./JG 2, is a Fw 190 A-3; W.Nr. 2194 appears on both sides of the fin. These photos were taken summer of 1942, at Cherbourg, France.

Pilot is unknown.

In the canopy is long-neck pilot's armor with no support wires. "Yellow 13" suffered two mishaps while with JG 2: one on 6 June 1942, it crashed-landed due to engine failure with 20% damage. The second was on 31 June 1942, when the undercarriage collapsed upon landing causing 30% damage. Both incidents happened at the Theville Airfield, Cherbourg.

These two views show the complete *Adlerflügel* on both sides of the fuselage.

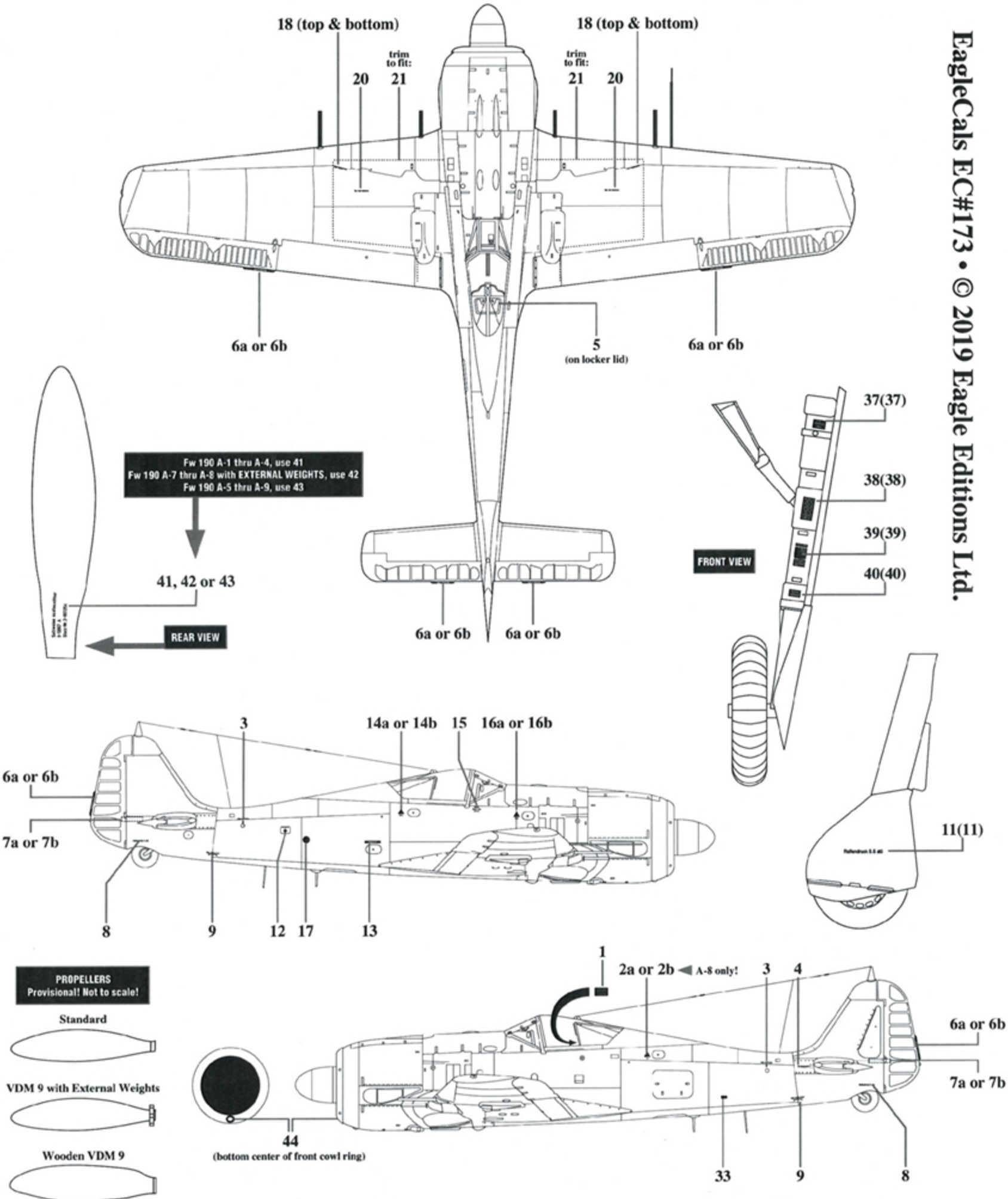
The Yellow rudder is prominent.

On 22 January, 1943, now with *Jagdgruppe Ost* (East), "Yellow 12" experienced another engine failure with 15% damage.

Fw 190 A-2 "**Yellow 12**" **W.Nr. 5335** **3./JG 26** **May 1942** **St. Omer, France**

This Arado built Fw 190 A-2 was flown by Oblt. Rolf Hermichen when he scored his 14th victory on 9 May 1942.

Colors: Upper Surfaces: RLM 75/74; Black *Adlerflügel* on both sides of fuselage

Lower Surfaces: RLM 76; Yellow under cowling and rudder.

Prop and spinner: RLM 70 Black-Green

National Insignia: Fuselage; B3 800 mm Black and White crosses; H2a 420 mm black and White *Hakenkreuz*

Wings: Upper ~ B1a 910 mm Black and White Crosses with thin Black outline, use decals from 'b' sheet

Lower ~ B3 900 mm Black and White crosses

Stenciling: Factory standard. Note trim tab stencil on rudder. Black victory bars on both sides of rudder

Colors: Upper Surfaces: RLM 75/74; Yellow rudder; extra large chevrons; Green '2' outlined in White behind fuselage cross

Lower Surfaces: RLM 76; Yellow under cowling

Prop and spinner: RLM 70 Black-Green

National Insignia: Fuselage; B2 800 mm Black and White crosses w/thin Black outline; H2a 420 mm Black & White *Hakenkreuz*

Wings: Upper ~ B1a 910 mm Black and White Crosses with thin Black outline, use decals from 'b' sheet

Lower ~ B2 900 mm Black and White with thin Black outline

Colors: Upper Surfaces: RLM 75/74; Black eagle trimmed in White on both sides of cowling

Lower Surfaces: RLM 76; Yellow under cowling and rudder

Prop and spinner: RLM 70 Black-Green

National Insignia: Fuselage; B2 800 mm Black and White crosses; H2a 420 mm Black & White *Hakenkreuz*

Wings: Upper ~ B1a 910 mm Black and White Crosses with thin Black outline, use decals from 'b' sheet

Lower ~ B2 900 mm Black and White with thin Black outline

Stenciling: Factory standard; W.Nr. 2194 on both sides of fin

Pilot: Ofw. Josef Heinzeller. An emblem of his German Schnauzer with the name 'Schnauzel' on engine cowl, name 'Old Snap' on the port side.

Colors: Upper Surfaces: RLM 75/74

Lower Surfaces: RLM 76; Yellow under cowling and rudder

Prop and spinner: RLM 70 Black-Green

National Insignia: Fuselage; B2 800 mm Black and White crosses; H2a 420 mm Black & White *Hakenkreuz*

Wings: Upper ~ B1a 910 mm Black and White Crosses with thin Black outline, use decals from 'b' sheet

Lower ~ B2 900 mm Black and White with thin Black outline
