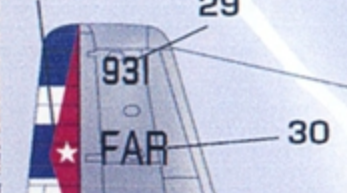
A 26 B BIAFRAN AIR FORCE

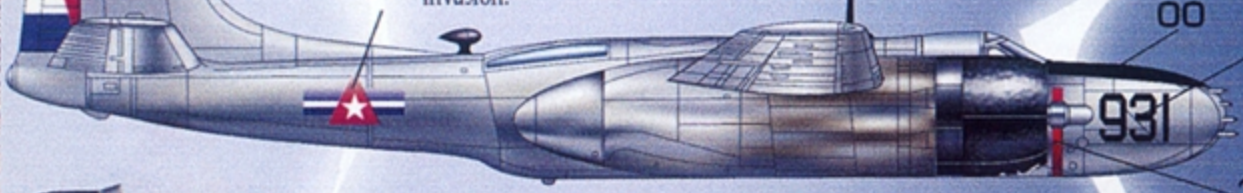
UNDERSURFACE PALE BLUE FS 25526

A 26 B CIA INVADER Operation pluto

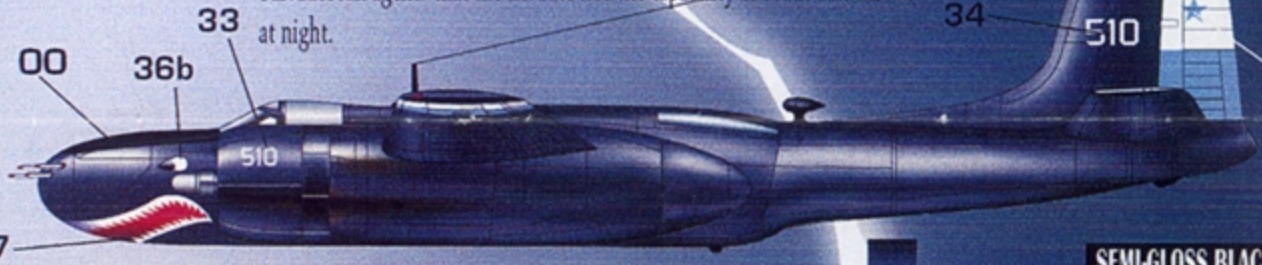


Faded natural metal with black engine nacelles.

B-26 K USAF. OPERATION STEEL TIGER : Laos 1966-1969

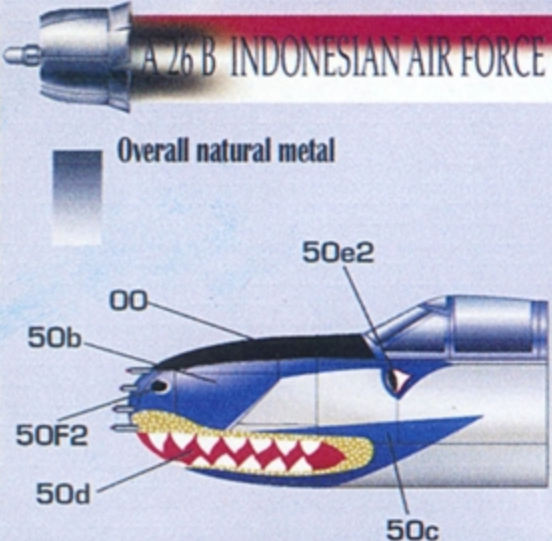
Based at Nakhon Phanom, Thailand. This Invader was a Congo veteran '646 in 1967



A 26 B INDONESIA AIR FORCE

Allocated to Skadron 1, at Abdurachman Salah, Malang, Java. Used for tactical air support, interdiction and long-range reconnaissance. This particular a/c made its last flight on 7/12/1977, making it the last fully armed B-26 in military service anywhere in the world.

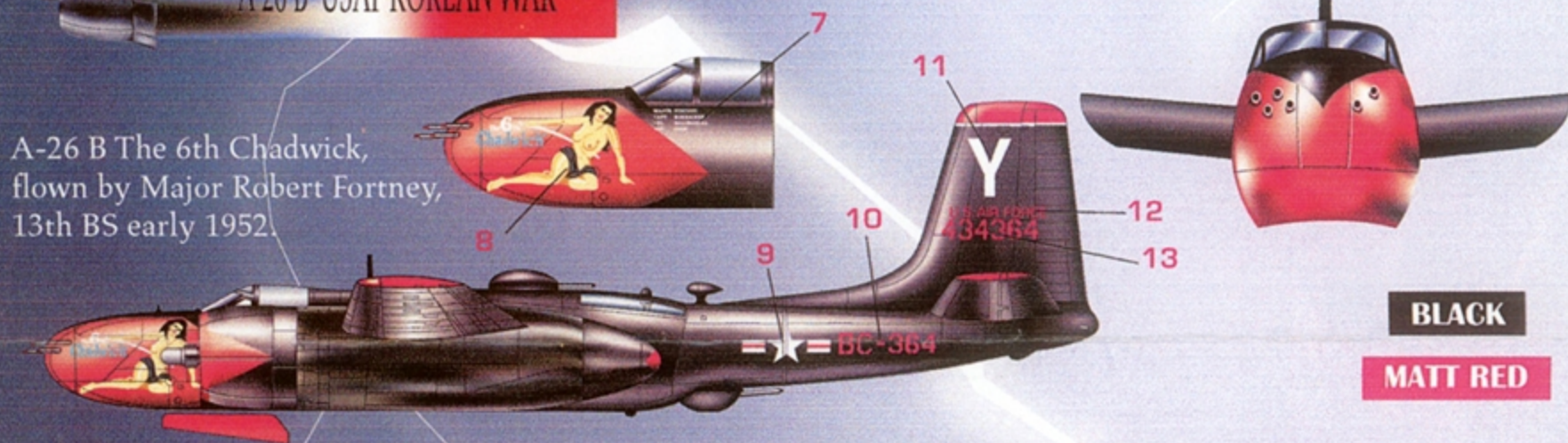

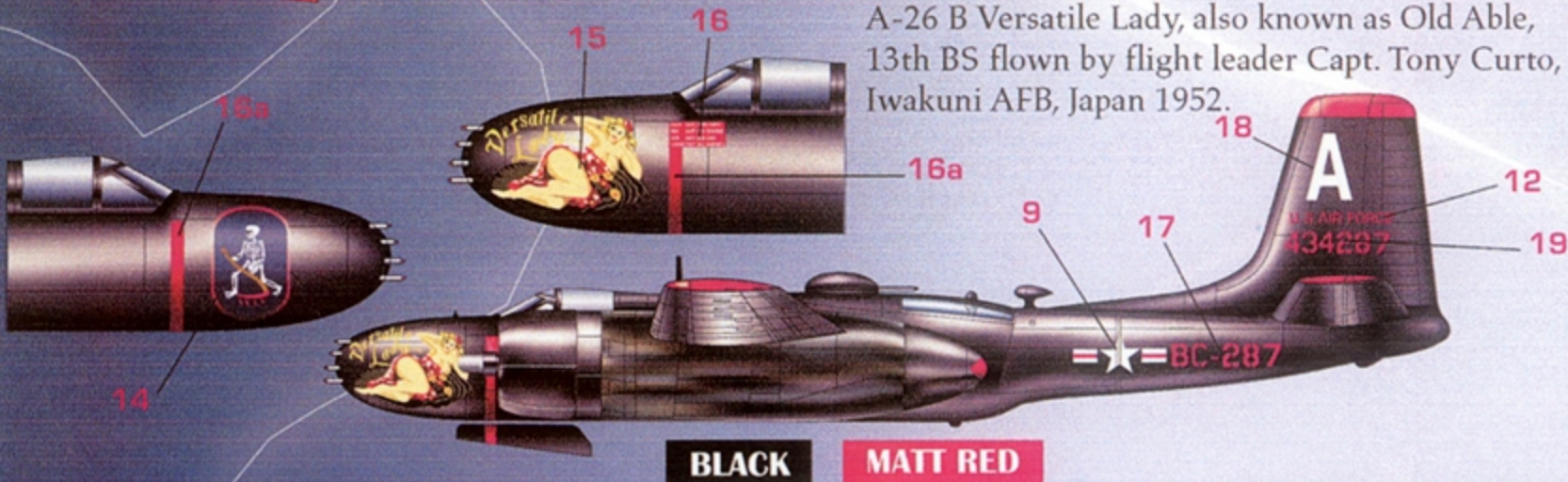

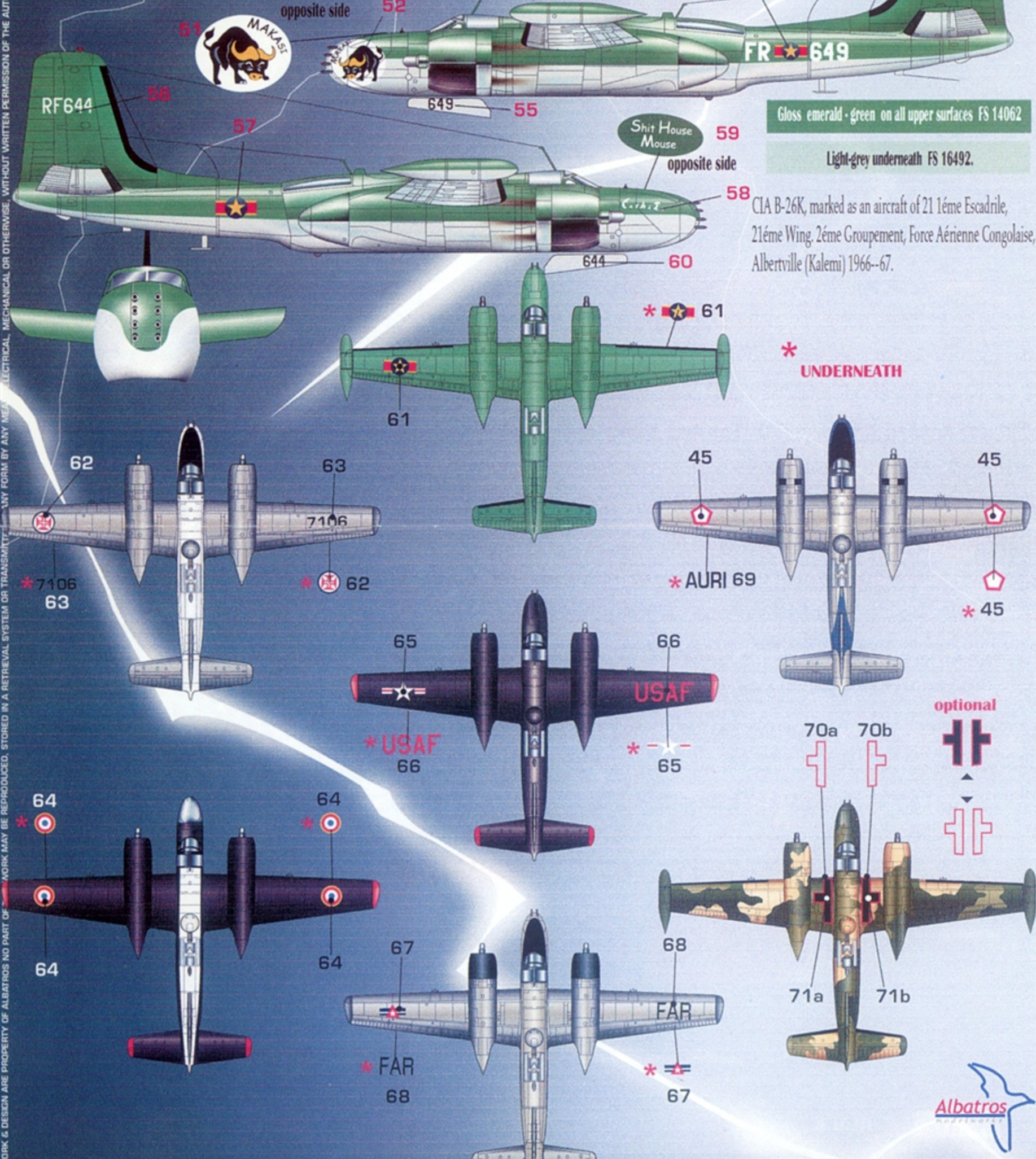
