A-7s were delivered to Air National Guard units in the typical Southeast Asia camouflage scheme of two greens and a tan over a light gray bottom. By the very early 1980s, the light gray on the bottom of the jet was deleted, and the camouflage pattern was carried over to the bottom of the jet. This was simply called the SEA 'wrap around' scheme.

The final two camouflage schemes worn by USAF A-7s are shown here. The two-tone scheme consisting of dark green and dark gray was known as the European One scheme, consisting of a dark green (FS34079) and a dark gray (36081). Maintenance and USAF insignia were typically black on this scheme, which began to appear in the mid 1980s. This was replaced in the very late 1980s by the two-tone gray scheme, which retained the same pattern as the European One scheme, but used FS 36118 and 36270 grays. On this scheme, maintenance stencils and USAF insignia could have been black on earlier versions and opposing shades of gray on later machines.
