



"The tiger Marking", one of the most artistic as well as bold markings among IJAAF units, Dates back to April 1939, when the commander adapted the marking A for the unit emblem. Such tiger

(1a+1b)

saying that tiger runs a vast distance and gets back. This emblem was initially applied on rear fuselage, but around the end of 1942 moved to vertical tail in full chord. The new commander, Captain Shin-ich Kodama, asked a professional painter, Mr. Takagi to apply this marking on each A/C by hand drawing. This is why every marking is different. Note that this unit was a good competitor to the American AVG or the 23rd FG who also featured a tiger as their emblem
