


General arrangement showing position of upper and lower wing markings.



Suitable kit is the Fly Bristol 170 Mk 31 Freighter.





General Instructions: For best results they should be applied to degreased surfaces. Cut around the required decal with a sharp blade and dip into water for a few seconds. As the decal leaves the backing paper carefully slide the decal onto the model. Press down gently with a soft tissue or cloth. If corners are positioned the decal correctly place a few drops of water around the decal and float it into the correct position. Leave the decal to dry. They can be overcoated with varnish as required. These decals have not been tested with proprietary final softening or setting solutions to avoid loss of texture at their edges.


Warning: These decals are extremely thin so exercise care when applying them. Use by 2009.

Bristol Freighter 170 Mk31E EI-AFR St. Ronan



EI-AFA St. Laurence O'Toole was built as a C-47A and always fitted with the large cargo door. It entered service with Aer Lingus on 26 November 1948 and was withdrawn from service on 29 October 1963. Throughout its service it wore various colour schemes and saints names including St. Kevin, St. Fergal and St. Declan. It is shown here as it looked in 1952 in the Aer Lingus "thin stripe" scheme.



EI-ACE was built as a DC-3D and was always fitted with the small passenger door. It entered service with Aer Lingus on 27 February 1946 and served with the airline until 13 July 1964.
