


Ju 87 B Yellow G

Notes: Arguably, one of the most colorful Stukas to see operational service. Sadly, much of the scheme remains provisional. At this time, no photos exist of the right side of the aircraft confirming the application of the snake pattern to that side. An additional snake pattern is included for those modelers who wish to apply markings on both sides.

Colors: Undersurfaces RLM 65. Uppersurfaces RLM 70/71 probably oversprayed with Italian stocks of Giallo

Mimetico (FS 30266). Spinner tip: Red and Green with White stripe
