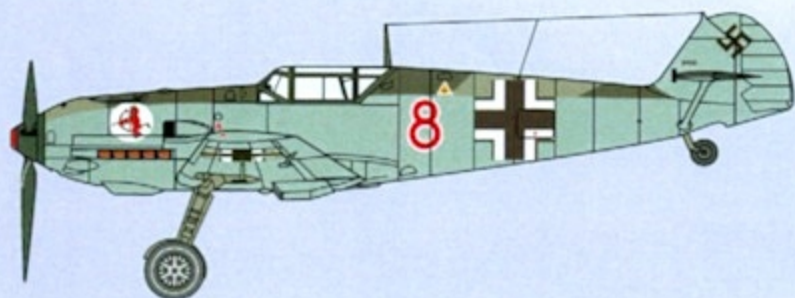

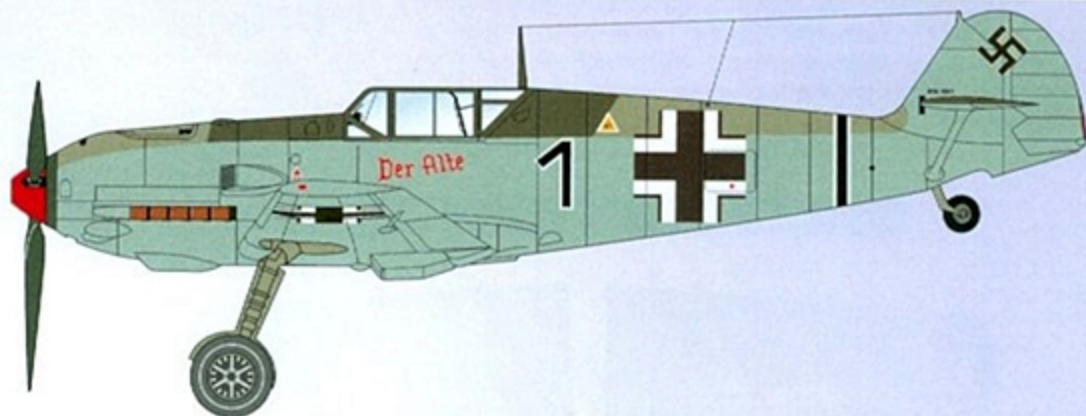
## Attack in the West Pt. I



Suggested Kit: Hasegawa, Tamiya, Hobbycraft Bf-109E Family

Bf-109E-1 of 5.(J)/TR. GR. 186 "Der Alte". Flown by Oblt. Dieter Robitzsch. Shot down May 10, 1940 by Dutch pilot Lt. Jan Law Overvest while flying a Fokker D.XXI! Camouflaged in splinter pattern of RLM 71 and RLM 02 over RLM 65. Red forward spinner.

Note: Apply White "Der Alte" first for greatest opacity. Notice A/C is an E-1 with a late E-4/7 canopy.



Bf-109E-1 OF 4./JG 51, Boblingen, April, 1940. Camouflaged in irregular pattern of RLM 70 and RLM 02 over RLM 65. White spinner.

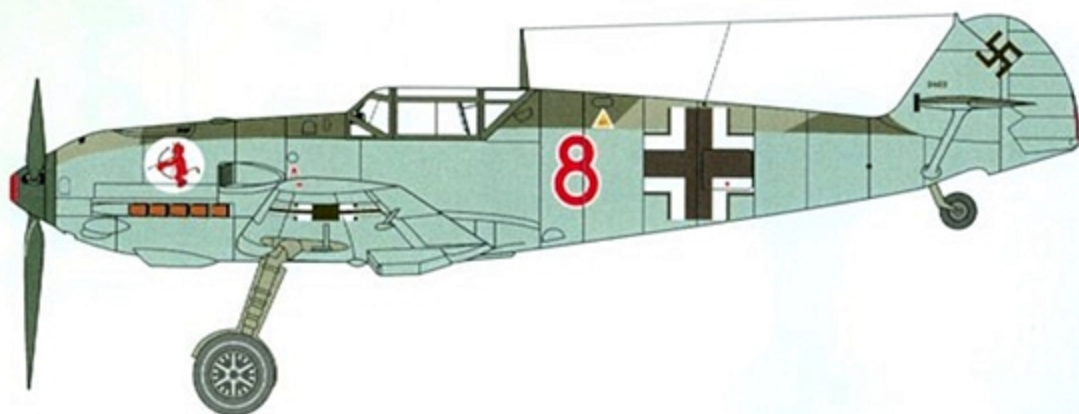


Bf-109E-3 of 6./JG26, France, January 1940. Camouflaged in splinter pattern of RLM 71 and RLM 02 over RLM 65. Brown tip of spinner.

Note:  
Wk. No. supplied for both sides of the aircraft, but may apply to only one. Consult your references.



Bf-109E-1 flown by UFFZ, Ludwig Beimeier of 2/JG52, France, 1940. Camouflaged in splinter pattern of RLM 71 and RLM 02 over RLM 65. Red tip of spinner. A/C number and spinner tip may have been Black (option provided).



Bf-109E-E-1 of 6./JG52 Speyer, March, 1940. Camouflaged in splinter pattern of RLM 71 and RLM 02 over RLM 65. Yellow tip of spinner. Rear-view mirror fitted.

Note: It is possible that the color of the spinner cap and number "3" be Red instead of Yellow. Use your judgement. Notice rear view mirror.
